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### ***"Pegasus"—The Gushing Fountain (Word)***

On January 26 and 27, 2020, the Lord spoke to my heart about the anointing (a subject I have mentioned several times in a number of writings). In particular, check out the following link.

Since the word that came to me was both of a personal and a corporate nature, I will paraphrase what came to me—I believe it is for all the Lord's people who seek to obey Him and who need encouragement in this hour.

As John reminds us: *And the anointing which you obtained from Him is [constantly] remaining in you, and you have no need that anyone may be [continually] teaching you, but as His anointing is [continuously] teaching you concerning all, and is [continuously] true, and is no lie, according as it [continuously] teaches you also, remain [continuously] in Him* (1 John 2:27 CLV [JM-NT]). Note that the words *continually* and *continuously* have been added. It is vital that we know the anointing as an on-going, continuous process and not a one-off event or something reserved for some select few; it is for all who are in Christ.

On these two days, the spirit of the Lord reminded me that we have this anointing and it is coming alive in His people. As I have said elsewhere, for the most part, **this anointing has been capped in God's people**. It is like a well of oil that is ready to gush, spewing forth *liquid gold*, as it was once called. But for this to occur, **the cap must be removed. I believe this is the next great move of the spirit of God in our day**. God knows the heart of His people and, as such, He knows the ones who have a true heart for Him; not necessarily a perfect heart, simply a heart that longs to know Him and His Son. In many respects, we all are still people of the flesh. ***But the days of our flesh*** (that is, the days of the flesh ruling over us; capping what resides in us) ***are coming to an end as the anointing within us rises up like a spring of fresh, clean, and pure water to go forth into the land***. This is the heart of what the Lord shared with me. The hour has come, not a fixed point in time but a period of time in which the anointing continuously grows and is released—***gushing forth as rivers of living water***.

With this word, I began inquiring of the Lord about His timing. For those who have followed some of my prophetic insights, you know that there are some years just ahead of us that might give us the answer, especially 2021, 2027, and 2032. I did not receive any further insight on these years other than what I have already reported. But then a strange word came to me, and I had no clue what it meant in light of the word about anointing; at least, not until I did some research.

At 6:58 am, on January 27, 2020, in regard to my inquiry, I heard: ***Pegasus!***

My first thought was to confuse Pegasus with Phoenix (as in rising from the ashes) and then Pergamum (with no connection to anything I had been told). I only share this to reveal how clueless I was as to the meaning of Pegasus.

However, after an initial very cursory search, I soon realized that Pegasus referred to the very word I was given about anointing. Only the Lord could pull this together for me. So, here is what I discovered.

Pegasus comes from Greek mythology and is the name of one of the starry constellations. In mythology, it is an immortal, pure white winged horse. Everywhere its hoof touched earth an inspiring water spring burst forth. The Greek poet Hesiod wrote that **Pegasus means "spring, well."**

Could we not agree that the connection of the *anointing, a spring of fresh, clean, and pure water*, to the meaning of this mythical horse is almost indisputable? With this, I turned to Bonnie Gaunt and her book *The Coming of Jesus*. Here are a few highlights from her book.

Pegasus is part of the Zodiac sign of *Aquarius*, being one of three accompanying constellations called *decans*. Aquarius is a beautiful story of the water bearer who holds a large urn, or bucket, from which flows the water of life. At the bottom of this stream is a large fish, signifying drinking in the water. The brightest star in this sign is called ***the record of the outpouring***. Gaunt reminds us that a very ancient prophecy concerning the coming of Jesus refers to Him as the one pouring the water from His bucket. The scripture that goes along with this is from Numbers 24:7: ***He makes water flow from his buckets, and his seed shall be in many waters***. The imagery is of the Lord Jesus pouring out of His spirit upon His body; the most significant event being the day of Pentecost after His final ascension to the throne of glory. The redeemed not only receive the outpouring of the waters of the holy spirit, but they also continually and continuously drink of this water that goes forth as gushing fountains of living water to refresh others. The outpouring becomes an outflowing! (Note attached picture as an illustration—PDF only.)

The first decan of Aquarius is the fish and the second one is the winged horse Pegasus; whose name means the ***horse of the gushing fountain***. Can you see how marvelous all of this is to the word that came to me? Pegasus, as the swiftly flying horse, comes with refreshing waters of life to a thirsty people. We who believe were those people, but now we are continually refreshed with the waters of life. The good news is that these same refreshing waters of life are for all humanity and a day is coming when Jesus, as typified riding on a white horse, will come once again, but only this time to refresh the masses, the many, not just the relative few. In this regard, Pegasus typifies not simply what many call *the first and second comings of Christ*, but more inclusively any time He shows up (His presence), whether it is for only one person or the multitudes, or whenever the Lord's people manifest as gushing fountains. Here are some verses that go along with Pegasus.


He shall descend like rain on the grassland, like showers, drenching the earth. (Psalm 72:6 CLV)

And the spirit and the bride are saying, 'Come!' and let him who is hearing say, 'Come!' And let him who is thirsting come. Let him who will, take the water of life gratuitously." (Revelation 22:17 CLV)

On the last day of the feast, the great day, Jesus stood up and cried out, "If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, '***Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water.***'" (John 7:37-38 ESV [bold italic added])

For the discerning, I know the connection of this mythical horse to Jesus as the Anointed One is so obvious that it needs no further explanation.
