Shock is Coming—Victory is in the Air

I believe I have been given some good news to report, but before doing so, it is important to know something about the number 17. So, this is the starting point.

Hebrew Peh—17th Letter

The seventeenth letter of the Hebrew language is *peh*, which has a numeric value of 80. Its literal meaning is *mouth*, which symbolically refers to *speech* or *words*. The number 80 is an intensification of the number 8, which refers to *new creation* or *new beginning*. The factor of 10 (i.e., 8 x 10) furthers this meaning since 10 signifies the *beginning of a new order*¹. All of these symbols point to one thing—the Lord Jesus who is the Word of God, the one who spoke forth creation with the words *let there be*. His voice (speech) went forth and creation, as we know it, came into being. Millennia later, in our first century, this same one appeared on earth to usher in a new-creation man in His image by dying on a cross and being resurrected from among the dead, ascending back to His Father in glory, and sending forth His life-giving spirit to ultimately fill a new creation (new heaven and new earth), leading to a new beginning for mankind.

Seventh Prime Number—17

The number 17 is the seventh in the series of prime numbers² (1,3,5,7,11,13,17). The **number 7** signifies ***divine, spiritual perfection***. Apart from the number 1, it is the most widely referenced number in scripture to the point that many things are based on a series of sevens. The book of Revelation is a prime example. Gematrically, it also appears quite often as a factor in words and expressions. As important as these are, there is something far more important that comes to the forefront based on the word *perfection*. Based on its root (*perfect*), *perfection* refers to *accomplishment, completion, consummation*. Truly, Jesus is the definition and personification of spiritual perfection.

And **being perfected (brought to completion; accomplished the goal)**, He became the cause of eonian (age-durative) deliverance (salvation; rescue) for all who are habitually obeying Him... (Hebrews 5:9)

If indeed, then, **perfection** could have been attained through the Levitical priesthood—for on this basis the people received the law—what need is there further still to speak of appointing another kind of priest according to the order of Melchizedek, not one according to the order of Aaron? (Hebrews 7:11)

For by one offering **He has perfected for all time those who are sanctified.** (Hebrews 10:14)

And **you are complete (made full, perfected) in Him (Jesus),** Who is the Head of every sovereignty and authority... (Colossians 2:10)

As the last Adam, Jesus is a life-giving spirit, and this requires spiritual perfection in order to perfect or make complete His brethren. Thus, God's Son not only personifies the number 7 but also defines it, and this perfection leads to victory as signified by the number 17.

Adding 1-17 = 153—Sons of God

Adding the numbers from 1 to 17 (e.g., 1+2+3+4 etc.) yields the number 153; a number that appears only in John 21:11 where the disciples caught 153 fish. The gematria of the expression *beni ha elohim*, translated *sons of God*, is 153. With one slight deviation³, *beni ha elohim* appears seven times in scripture. Could we not say that 153 signifies the many perfected sons of God brought unto glory through the perfect, even perfected Son?

For it was fitting that He, for whom and by whom all things exist, in bringing many sons to glory, **should make the author** (prince, captain, founder, pioneer) of their salvation **perfect through suffering.** (Hebrews 2:10)

Written Form of 17—Yod-Zayin

In Hebrew, the **number 17** is written as **yod-zayin**.

Of the two words, *yod* is by far the most intriguing letter. It is the smallest letter of the Hebrew alphabet and the most frequently occurring letter in scripture. Significantly, it is found in the name of God, *Yahweh* (*hey-vav-hey-yod*)⁴. Because of this, some claim *yod* refers to the Creator as the single point (singularity) of all creation, the very source of all life—the starting point of the presence of God in all things. Others say it speaks of humility (meekness). Pictorially, it is seen as a **hand** or an **arm**, signifying **responsibility, authority, control, deed, to make, to fulfill**.

Again, this points to God's Son who came to this earth to do a work for His Father, a work to rescue the human race from itself; and, through the cross, He finished the work (i.e., deed) necessary for the rescue mission. It was Jesus' responsibility to save, deliver, rescue, to fulfill the mission, and He did just that and continues to do so for the glory of God. We could say that Jesus is His Father's right hand, seated with all authority and power.

Your right hand, Yahweh, is glorious in power. Your right hand, Yahweh, dashes the enemy in pieces. (Exodus 15:6 WEB)

A declaration of Elohim to my Lord: **Sit at My right hand**, until I place Your enemies as Your footstool. (Psalm 110:1) [Repeated five times in the NT: Matthew 22:44; Mark 12:36; Luke 20:42-43; Acts 2:34-35; Hebrews 1:13]

And Jesus came up and spoke to them, saying, **All authority [and power] has been given to Me in heaven and on earth.** ... From now on, **the Son of Man will be seated at the right hand of the power of God.** (Matthew 28:18 ... Luke 22:69)

Now possessing the fullness of faith and holy spirit, looking intently into heaven, he perceived the glory of God, and **Jesus, standing at the right hand of God**, and said, "Lo! I am beholding the heavens opened up, and **the Son of Mankind standing at the right hand of God.**" (Acts 7:55-56 CLV)

To use a common expression, Jesus is God's *right-hand man*.

Pictorially, *zayin* is shaped like a **sword** (i.e., a weapon), signifying **to cut, to cut off**. Paul tells us that *the weapons of our warfare are not fleshly* (2 Corinthians 10:4). First, this is a clear warning that the Lord's people are in a battle. Second, however, we are not left defenseless. This war is to be fought through **the sword of the spirit, which is the word of God** (Ephesians 6:17). Thus, we get the picture of the sword of the spirit—being wielded like a knife that is more powerful and sharper than any two-edged sword (Hebrews 4:12)—cutting off or dividing out all that is not of the life-giving spirit of God.

In addition, *zayin* is also seen as a **scepter, rod, or staff**, signifying **an emblem of royalty; sovereign power or strength**. In other words, it is a symbol of a king's authority. In this case, it speaks mightily of the one who is the Word of God, who has all authority in heaven and on earth, who is seated (i.e., reigning) at the right hand of God the Father, and who holds the scepter of the Kingdom of God as God's king.

Your throne, O Elohim (Yeshua-Jesus), is for the eon and further; a scepter of equity (uprightness, justice) is **the scepter (or: rod) of Your (Yeshua-Jesus) kingdom**. You

(Yeshua-Jesus) love righteousness and hate wickedness; Therefore Elohim, Your Elohim (the Father) has anointed You with the oil of joy above Your companions (partners). (Psalm 45:6-7)

God says about His Son: ‘Your throne, O God (Elohim), is to the age of the age; a **scepter of righteousness is the scepter of Your reign** (kingdom)’ (Hebrews 1:8)

It is through the life of King Jesus in us that we fight the good fight by being strong in Him and in the strength of His might, standing firm in His faith. As the Word of God, the Son holds the scepter, the rod of strength of the Kingdom of God. He is the ultimate weapon that cuts off all enemies. He alone abolishes (cuts off) the last and greatest enemy—death (1 Corinthians 15:26). As the Word, He brought forth creation, and as the Word, He slays all that is unlawful, even by the breath of His mouth (2 Thessalonians 2:8).

10 (Yod) + 7 (Zayin) = 17

In the Hebrew alphabet, *yod* is the number 10 and *zayin* the number 7. Both numbers could be called *perfection numbers*. We’ve already seen that 7 signifies *divine, spiritual perfection*; clearly pointing to God’s Son.

Now, **10** signifies *ordinal perfection*. Stated another way, it represents the **full manifestation of what is in view (i.e., ordinal completion—perfection; completion of order; starting an altogether new series of numbers)**.

There are many examples of ordinal series in scripture, based in 10. The *Ten Commandments* that sum up the law are the most well-known. Through Jesus’ own testimony, He was and still is the perfect fulfillment of the law. In Him, we see *yod* on full display, as He brought about an ordinal perfection of the law.

Think not that I have come to destroy or demolish the law (or: Torah), or the prophets: on the contrary, **I have not come to destroy or demolish, but to fulfil [make full]**. (Matthew 5:17)

But there is more; according to E.W. Bullinger⁵, the union of 10 and 7 speaks of **the perfection of spiritual order**. Today, the world order is driven by carnal flesh. It doesn’t take much spiritual discernment to clearly see this. The hope for the *kosmos* (orderly arrangement of the world system) is to have a new order, a new way for things to operate, even a new energy source to drive it. Perfection has a purpose and this union explains and magnifies it. The mission of God’s Son is to fulfill the work (*yod*-work) of bringing about a

new and complete spiritual order, a divine order filled with the glory of God. We could say that this starts with what Paul describes as the *one new man* in Christ (Ephesians 2:15); those perfected and made complete in Him as sons in union with the Son. But this is only part of the mission. It goes beyond the corporate body of Christ to the purpose of having a people made complete, perfected in Him. Paul explains it as the *summing up or heading up all things in heaven and on earth in Christ* (Ephesians 1:10) or *subjecting all things under His feet in order to deliver up the Kingdom to God the Father so that He may be all in all* (1 Corinthians 15:23-28). This is the ultimate purpose of God.

Romans 8—the Victory of 17

One of the most important applications of the number 17 is Paul's victory list in Romans 8:35, 38-39, for it reveals the Victor and, in His love, the ones He leads through the many trials of life into His victory, summed up in 17 words or expressions.

- (31) What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us?
(32) He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things?
(33) Who shall bring any charge against God's chosen ones? God the Justifier?
(34) Who is to condemn? **Christ Jesus** is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is **at the right hand of God**, who indeed is interceding for us.
(35) What shall be separating us from the love of God in Christ Jesus? **Shall [1] tribulation, or [2] distress, or [3] persecution, or [4] famine, or [5] nakedness, or [6] danger, or [7] sword?**
(36) As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered."
(37) But rather, within all these things we are **remaining completely victorious; (continue more than conquering) through the One loving us.**
(38) For I am sure that neither **[8] death** nor **[9] life**, nor **[10] angels** nor **[11] rulers**, nor **[12] things present** nor **[13] things to come**, nor **[14] powers**,
(39) nor **[15] height** nor **[16] depth**, nor **[17] anything else in all creation**, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Interestingly, Paul divided the list in a series of seven and then ten, which is the exact breakdown of *yod* [10]-*zayin* [7]. The letters of Hebrew words read right to left (not left to right as in English); thus, Paul as a Hebrew followed the same pattern of listing seven first (*zayin*), followed by ten (*yod*). The first seven are part of the question, whereas the last ten are the answer to it.

What is the key to this victory? Verses 37 and 39 give us the answer. Love! This love is two-fold. First, the love of God is discovered in the Son of God's love. Second, the love of the one who loved us and continues to love us is poured out in our hearts (Romans 5:5). It's the fuel that gives us the victory in Christ. As Paul tells us, **love never fails** (1 Corinthians 13:8). The **number 16** signifies **love**. Numerically preceding 17, love (16) leads to victory (17) every time. It cannot fail to do so. When God's creative love is in action, it inevitably leads to victory. After all, **God is love**, and His love was on full display when He sent the Son of His love to this earth to rescue it by dying on a cross. Love is sourced in the Father and in His Son. To make sure we know the full extent of this love, the holy spirit made Paul's 17th entry "anything else in all creation". Perfect love fills God's creation.

All the above reveals that the **number 17 spells V-I-C-T-O-R-Y**, and this victory spells King Jesus and the many perfected sons of God brought into glory to reign with Him. The goal is to usher in a new order for the world and to bring forth many sons of God transformed into the image of the Pattern Son—JESUS. During the process, we are remaining completely victorious because Jesus is victory and His love is the driving energy of this victory.

A Word and a Vision

Now, all of this leads to the good news. On **June 6, 2022**, my sleep was broken into with a very straightforward proclamation:

The whole world will be shocked!

This was followed by a **vision of an LED clock that read 17 in blue numbers**. The minutes did not appear. For those of us who use the 12-hour clock, 17 hours would not make much sense. However, on a 24-hour clock, used in the military, it does. If I had seen this as the number 5, it would have appeared as such; but it didn't, so the message relates to the number 17, not 5.

Immediately, I wondered whether the shock was going to be good or bad to the world. I didn't have an answer until my wife told me later in the day that **June 6 was the anniversary of the start of D-Day** when, early in the morning of June 6, 1944, the Allies stormed the beaches of Normandy to begin a fierce march to Berlin⁶. Eleven months later, on May 7-9, 1945, the European war was over as the Nazi regime surrendered.

That this came to me in the early morning hours on the 78th anniversary of D-Day is a clear indication, if not a reminder, that we are presently in a spiritual battle. Yes, carnal man is battling on many fronts but there are spiritual, dark forces driving it. The good news,

however, is just as the war was won eleven months later and a new world order (new civilization) formed in the decades to follow, so too will our present war be won and a new world order, a spiritual order unlike any ever seen, be formed.

This is an encouragement that we know the outcome. Victory is now in the air. Yes; there is still an ongoing battle to be won, but we are assured that it is won because the Victor is in this battle, waging the [final battle for humanity](#). He alone holds the scepter of the Kingdom of God. His rod of strength knows how to knock out all the enemies that are attempting to lead the world into a dystopian nightmare. He is on a mission to subject all things under His feet for His Father and He will not fail, for victory always follows love.

The color blue adds to this victory, for it signifies ***water—the river of God, rulership, the heavens, God's throne***. It is a reminder that the *heavens do rule* and that rulership has been given to God's Son who is seated at the right hand of His Father in power and glory.

Could it be that part of the shock will come when the enemies of God are exposed and defeated for all the world to see? Or, better yet; could it be that the shock is the very Presence of the King of all kings, along with the transformation of the sons of God, His chosen ones trained up through the seven words of Romans 8, the ones who have fought the good fight, applying the weapons of God, expressed by the 153 fishes—the *beni ha elohims, the sons of God*? Are the rivers of living water that have been trickling out of the Lord's anointed body about to gush forth like an uncapped well under pressure, going forth throughout the earth unhindered and with great power from on high? After all, the primary message I have been given to declare is the Presence of the King and the Anointing of His body openly manifesting the Kingdom of God to all the nations. The combination of the Presence and the Anointing introduces to all the inhabitants of earth the perfection of spiritual-divine order. [Civilization as we have known it](#) since the end of WW2 must end so that a new civilization rises up—a new order based on the perfection of God's Son.

I'm not going to dig any deeper into an interpretation. I'll leave it with these questions as we wait and see. One thing is for sure, however—**Victory is in the air!**

May our eyes be opened more and more to see what great things God is doing in this day, even in the midst of darkness and chaos and confusion. Let us not overlook this fact: the structures must crumble, and the dark forces that are trying to destroy this world and humanity itself are part of these structures. They have no place to go but down into the dust of the earth, and so they will. They are defeated! They are about to be shocked into oblivion, and the world that has been in bondage to them will be shocked to see it. May we be spiritually shocked by coming into the Presence of the one who loves us and makes us victorious through His love. Nothing in all creation will ever separate us from this love!
